

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, October 16, 2023 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Charlie Hughes called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

Mayor Hughes asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Roll Call; Councilors Kelma Burch, Derek Meyer and Tyrrell Tankersley. City Superintendent Blaine Medina was also present. Council President Greg Graff and Councilor and Tammie Meyer-Givens were absent. Also in attendance were Jim Kreutzer, Rob Taylor and Aron White.

Burch moved Tankersley seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Tankersley moved Meyers seconded to approve the consent agenda items A-C. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Hughes opened the floor to public comments. Jim Kreutzer was present to discuss vehicles on his property.

Superintendent Medina shared American Implement contacted him about a new 2023 5100 E tractor that came available for \$82,000 and will have a warranty. The tractor that was approved for in the prior meeting was used and did not have a warranty. The New Holland tractor was sold for \$30,000 which would make a total of \$52,000 we would actually pay for the new tractor.

Burch moved Meyers seconded to purchase the 2023 5100E John Deere Tractor from American Implement for \$82,000. Motion carried unanimously.

Superintendent Medina gave an update on the Highway 96 project. Nowak will finish up the drainage on the east side this week. Koss has been busy prepping the west side with the sub base pack and hauling in sand. As soon as Nowak is finished Koss will prep the east side. Koss is hoping to start laying the 20 foot strip of concrete by October 31, 2023.

City Superintendent Medina reported the crew will be making sure all manholes are winterized. The salt storage unit will be cleaned out with the help of the Fire Department. All business alleys have had millings applied, now the crew will focus on the alleys that get bad during wet weather.

City Clerk Hassell shared the server went down on Tuesday, October 10th. Palace Computers set up the office with a new server and were back up and running Thursday afternoon. Estimated cost for the new server will be \$8,000 to \$10,000. Hassell shared information on all the classes and conferences she has attended. Hassell will be out of the office on vacation October 18th through October 31st.

Burch moved Givens seconded for adjournment at 6:53 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
