

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, March 2, 2020 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Charlie Hughes called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Hughes asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Role Call; Council President Levi Elder, and Councilors Jody Crouch, Kelma Burch, Tammie Meyer-Givens, Tyrrell Tankersley, City Superintendent Joel Landis were present. Also in attendance were Rob Taylor, Liz Gould and Deb Fairchild. City Attorney Becky Faurot was absent.

The Mayor opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Crouch moved Burch seconded to appoint The Native Sun as the City of Leoti's official newspaper. Motion carried unanimously.

Elder moved Burch seconded to approve the agenda with the addition of items: a. Airport Runway project, b. WCHC Emergency Assistance Agreement under New Business and item b. Executive Session-Personnel. Motion carried unanimously.

Crouch moved Givens seconded to approve the consent agenda items A-D. Motion carried unanimously.

Council reviewed City Attorney Faurots report. Council discussed the Langdon carport issue.

Mayor Hughes welcomed Deb Fairchild who was present to address snow removal on Indian Road between the schools.

Deb Fairchild left the meeting at 6:43 p.m.

City Treasurer Gould shared the CD Bids received from Western State Bank and Security State Bank. Council agreed to allow City Treasurer Gould to manage investments prioritizing the high bidder.

Mayor Hughes opened the floor to the public comments. There were none.

City Superintendent Landis reported that he is still working on getting three bids/quotes for work that needs to be done on the south water tower (interior lining). Landis discussed the holes on 5<sup>th</sup> Street.

Council reviewed the report submitted by City Clerks Hassell. Hassell reported that we received a letter of regret for the Broadway-Wyoming Multimodal Project. A work session with the Aim Coalition and USD 467 will be set up to discuss what to do with the funds that were set aside for the project.

Council looked over and agreed to apply for the City Connecting Link Improvement Program Application (CCLIP) for KS HWY 25-160 ft N of KS HWY 96 to the N side of the I Street intersection. If awarded, this project would include replacement of existing concrete pavement with concrete pavement and base reconstruction as well as spot curb and gutter replacements to correct broken or displaced curbing.

Mayor Hughes discussed with council about the Airport Runway Project. The contractor for the project has asked for information about bulk water for the project.

Mayor Hughes presented council with an emergency assistance agreement with Wichita County Health Center. Council agreed for Mayor Hughes to sign the agreement.


Council discussed the cleanup of the trailer park located on Wichita Road.

Crouch moved, Burch seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss a matter involving a city employee evaluation for 5 minutes with Council. Motion carried unanimously. Regular meeting resumed at 7:25 p.m. Mayor Hughes declared no action taken.

Crouch moved, Burch seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss a matter involving a city employee evaluation for 5 minutes with Council. Motion carried unanimously. Regular meeting resumed at 7:30 p.m. Mayor Hughes declared no action taken.

Crouch moved, Burch seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss a matter involving a city employee evaluation for 5 minutes with Council and City Clerk. Motion carried unanimously. Regular meeting resumed at 7:35p.m. Mayor Green declared no action taken.
