City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, January 6, 2025 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Chris Kreutzer called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Kreutzer asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Roll Call; Council President Derek Meyer, Councilors Kelma Burch, Aron White and Jim Kreutzer. Also present were City Superintendent Blaine Medina and City Attorney Charles Moser

Mayor Kreutzer has met with the County Commissioner and asked if they would be willing to help bring a fireworks display back to Leoti for the Fourth of July holiday. The Commissioners agreed they would be interested in helping. Mayor Kreutzer contacted a fireworks distributor in Ellinwood for information and cost. A 2024 Dodge Ram 2500 (Crew Cab) from Lewis Automotive in Hays for \$49,984.95. Medina is waiting on a quote from J & R Car and Truck Center in Scott City. Council tabled the topic until the next meeting.

J. Kreutzer made a motion to approve Vivo Fuels LLC Cereal Malt Beverage License Renewal-Off Premise. Burch seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

City Attorney Moser shared information on the small claims court appeal. Moser will keep council up to date on the process.

City Superintendent Blaine Medina reported he has reached out to KDOT for direction on placing the BCBS Pathways cross walks and flashing signs. The 20 mph signs on 7th Street have been placed. The city crew has been hauling concrete left from the 7th Street Project out to the landfill to be crushed. Medina will take his water certification test at the end of January.

City Clerk Hassell shared the office staff have been finishing up year-end processes and ready for 2025. Hassell and Deputy Clerk Medina had conference call with Edmunds the new financial software city hall will be moving to. This process will take a year to complete.
