City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Tuesday, April 8, 2025 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room. (The meeting was moved from April 7, 2025 to April 8, 2025 due to lack of a quorum.)

Mayor Chris Kreutzer called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Kreutzer asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Roll Call; Council President Derek Meyer, Councilors Aron White and Jim Kreutzer. Also present were City Superintendent Blaine Medina, Code Enforcement Officer Shane Harris, City Attorney Charles Moser, Luke Smith and Jenny Adams.

Mayor Kreutzer opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

White moved Meyer seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

The Consent Agenda items included: a. March 17, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes, b. Payroll warrants \$20,749.10, c. Payroll warrants \$15,072.61, d. Payroll warrants \$21,077.53, e. Accounts Payable warrants \$170,507.46. (The warrants were available for review).

Meyer moved White seconded to approve the consent agenda items a-e. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Kreutzer welcomed Luke Smith, Leoti Airport Inc. Smith explained the airport is owned by the City of Leoti and Wichita County. The process of applying for grants and such requires approval from owners of the entity. Smith asked for the City's approval to grant authority to Leoti Airport, Inc to operate and manage the Mark Hoard Memorial Airport. This would include signing any and all grants related to the Mark Hoard Memorial Airport, as deemed necessary for the continued operation and development of the facility.

White moved Meyer seconded to grant authority to Leoti Airport Inc to operate and manage the Mark Hoard Memorial Airport on behalf of the City of Leoti. Motion carried unanimously.

Luke Smith left the meeting at 6:34 pm.

J. Kreutzer moved Meyer seconded to approve chip sealing the southwest quadrant proposal from B & H Paving for \$105,875. Motion carried unanimously.

Meyer moved White seconded to approve the material quote for the water connection line to Wichita County Municipal Golf Course from Core and Main for \$13,569.14. Motion carried unanimously.

Meyer moved White seconded for the approval of donating trash services, 2-2 yard dumpsters and 8 to 10 - 96 gallon totes for the Extreme Cowgirl Challenge, May  $9^{th} - 11^{th}$ . Motion carried unanimously.

White moved J. Kreutzer seconded to approve the purchase of a water line radio detection locater from Subsurface Solutions for \$6,614.00. Motion carried unanimously.

City Attorney Moser shared he is waiting on the court date for the Scofield small claims court appeal. Moser has also been putting together an easement for the golf course water line project. It was brought to Moser's attention that the lowering of the speed limit on 7<sup>th</sup> Street will need to go through an engineering study and collect certain data to confirm the 20 mph speed limit is justified.

City council reviewed City Treasurer Liz Gould 2025 February and March financial reports.

Code Enforcement Officer Harris shared the skunk issue has slowed down, the dog kennel is completed other than putting in a doggie door. Harris is reminding residents of the watering restrictions, 12:00 pm to 7 pm. Resolving issues with chickens in the city limits. He also shared information with residents on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday Trash pick-up for unwanted items placed in yards.

City Superintendent Medina reported the 3 new storm sirens are being installed this week and should be online by Friday. Ideatek is working on the underground phase of the project and should be done with that in a couple of weeks. B & H Paving will be chip sealing the southwest quadrant either the end of May or beginning of June. Spraying sterilant on city properties is completed.

The next city council meeting is on Monday, April 21, 2025 at 6:30 pm.

There being no further business White made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:08 p.m. J. Kreutzer seconded. Motion carried.
