

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, June 16, 2025 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Chris Kreutzer called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Kreutzer asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Roll Call; Council President Derek Meyer, Councilors Kelma Burch, Aron White and Jim Kreutzer were present. City Superintendent Blaine Medina and City Attorney Charles Moser were absent.

Mayor Kreutzer opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

White moved Meyer seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

The Consent Agenda items included: a. June 2, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes, b. Payroll warrants \$19,930.48, c. Accounts Payable warrants \$232,737.47. (The warrants were available for review).

Meyer moved Burch seconded to approve the consent agenda items a-c. Motion carried unanimously.

Myer moved J. Kreutzer seconded to approve the proposal from Storm Sirens, Inc. to equip the M10 siren at the museum with a radio decoder which will be activated in unison with the City's three new sirens for \$2675.00. Motion carried unanimously.

Council discussed possible 2026 projects. An estimate of \$103,500.00 from Morgan Brothers Construction for replacement of curb and guttering on Main Street was received. Jones Construction gave an estimate of \$13,000 to fix the elevation in the big ditch on Highway 96. Council reviewed Wichita County Clerk's 2026 budget. Clerk Hassell reminded council of the audit review and budget workshop scheduled for Thursday, June 19, 2025 at 6:30 pm with Lewis, Hooper & Dick.

Meyer moved J. Kreutzer seconded to approve Ordinance 2025-02 ALLOWING CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR WITHIN SPECIALLY DESIGNATED AREAS AT A SPECIFIC LOCATIONS AND TIMES DURING THE WICHITA COUNTY FAIR ON JULY 31 TO AUGUST 2, 2025. Motion carried 3-1 with White opposing.

Mario Hernandez entered the meeting at 6:45 pm.

Council reviewed City Treasurer Gould's reports.

City Clerk Hassell shared the city crew have finished the flag project before Flag Day. City Hall has received numerous compliments from the community on the flags. There has been an interest in veterans' banners. We will need to have at least 15 orders to move forward. As of now we have 6 orders. Hassell reported the Code Enforcement officer position has been posted and two applications have been received. City Hall and Shop will be closed on Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup>.

Burch moved White seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss a matter involving an interview of a nonelected personnel position with Council, Mayor and Clerk for 10 minutes. The meeting resumed at 7:26 p.m. Mayor Kreutzer declared no action taken.

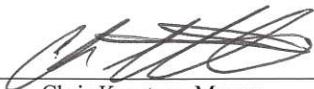
