

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, June 1, 2026 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Council President Derek Meyer called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Council President Meyer asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Roll Call; Councilors Rick Griem, Aron White (via Zoom) and Jim Kreutzer. Also present was City Superintendent Blaine Medina. Mayor Kreutzer was called out on a rural fire right before the meeting started. Councilor Kelma Burch and City Attorney Charles Moser were absent.

Council President Myer opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

J. Kreutzer moved White seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

The Consent Agenda items included: a. May 18, 2026 Regular Meeting Minutes, b. Payroll warrants \$16,039.05 c. Payroll warrants \$22,413.45 d. Accounts Payable warrants \$47,330.77 e. Accounts Payable warrants \$51,988.66. (The warrants were available for review).

J. Kreutzer moved Griem seconded to approve the consent agenda items a-e. Motion carried unanimously.

Council President Meyer opened the floor for public comments. There were no public comments

J. Kreutzer moved Griem seconded for the approval of Ordinance 2026-07 REPEALING ORDINANCE #2026-04, AND LIFTING THE BURN BAN IN THE CITY OF LEOTI, KANSAS. Motion carried unanimously.

White moved Griem seconded for the approval of Ordinance 2026-06 AMENDING THE ZONING REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF LEOTI, KANSAS; SECTION 902(4) OF THE ZONING REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF LEOTI, KANSAS.

City Superintendent Blaine Medina reported Sporer is now ready to install the hardware for the BCBS Pathways light cross walks. The city crew is spraying bindweed and will begin fogging for mosquitos soon. There was a water main break on Wyoming but was quickly taken care of. The ballfields are ready to go. Flags and Veteran banners were put up for Memorial Day. The Veteran banners will stay up until after the fair.


City Clerk Hassell shared the office staff has been working out a few bugs with the utility billing conversion but overall it has been a good experience.

Griem moved White seconded to recess into executive session pursuant to the nonelected personnel matters exception, K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(1), to discuss an employee for 5 minutes with Council, City Superintendent and City Clerk. Meeting resumed at 6:48 p.m. Griem moved J. Kreutzer second to give said employee discussed in executive session said increase to wages. Motion carried unanimously.
