

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session Monday, July 21, 2025 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Chris Kreutzer called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Kreutzer asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Roll Call; Council President Derek Meyer, Councilors Kelma Burch, Aron White and Jim Kreutzer were present. City Superintendent Blaine Medina and City Attorney Charles Moser were also present. Code Enforcement Officer Mario Hernandez was absent.

Mayor Kreutzer opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Burch moved J. Kreutzer seconded to approve the agenda with the addition of Unfinished Business a. Grant Writing. Motion carried unanimously.

The Consent Agenda items included: a. July 7, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes, b. Payroll warrants \$20,526.26, c. Accounts Payable warrants \$100,570.00, d. Accounts Payable warrants \$15,152.06 . (The warrants were available for review).

Burch moved J. Kreutzer seconded to approve the consent agenda items a-d. Motion carried unanimously.

Meyer moved Burch seconded to approve the grant consultant agreement with Aimee Baker. Motion carried 3 to 1, with White opposing.

City Attorney Moser shared information on the opioid settlements and public parking. Moser shared he will not be able to attend council meetings in person from August 18, 2025 through the end of September 2025. He will be available by phone or Zoom.

Council reviewed City Treasurer Gould's report.

City Superintendent Medina reported the city crew has been taking routine water samples for the state. The street sweeper has been busy and painting curbs that will be finished before fair. The mosquito fogger is down. We are currently waiting on a call back from tech support. The city crew has also been spraying bindweed.

City Clerk Hassell shared council with an update on the email scam linked to a current vendor. A report has been filed with the Sheriff's office, and the insurance company has been called. Hassell reminded council that City Hall will be closed on Fair Friday, August 1, 2025. The city crew will work until noon on Fair Friday. Friday's trash route will run as usual.

Discussion was held on the code enforcement position and job duties.


J. Kreutzer moved Meyer seconded to release the current code enforcement officer of his position. Motion carried 3 to 1, with White opposing.
