

City of Leoti Governing Body met in regular session September 7, 2021 at 6:30 p.m., at the City Hall Meeting Room.

Mayor Charlie Hughes called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Hughes asked City Clerk Jeannine Hassell for Role Call; Council President Levi Elder, Councilors Kelma Burch, Jody Crouch, Tammie Meyer-Givens, City Superintendent Travis Seaton and Code Enforcement Officer Adam Marcotte.
